[UN Global Initiative to Fight Human Trafficking](#) UN.GIFT UN Gift was conceived to promote the global fight on human trafficking, on the basis of international agreements reached at the UN. To date, 140 parties have signed the Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking in Persons especially Women and Children, which supplements the Palermo Convention against transnational organized crime.

Unseen Is a major UK Charity. It aims to work towards a world without slavery by supporting survivors, equipping stakeholders and influencing society. It is in part funded by UK National Lottery and has strong backing from many Partners, including the Clinton Global Initiative, The Home Office, The National Crime Agency.

Following discussions In December 2015 the UK Home Secretary Teresa May, [Polaris](#) (a leader in the global fight to eradicate modern slavery), and Google announced a plan to re-launch the UK helpline and Polaris issued a request for proposals from UK NGOs interested in operating this helpline. On 14th March, Polaris announced that it had selected Bristol-based charity Unseen to operate the enhanced UK Modern Slavery Helpline and Resource Centre for the United Kingdom.

Unseen will work with Polaris over the next year to prepare to handle calls about cases of modern slavery within the UK. Once launched in late 2016, victims and survivors of modern slavery will be able to contact the Centre to learn about their options and be connected to support services.
