After retirement found gainful employment in the Pentagon Federal Credit Union and then the McLean Group (our clients were mostly large financial institutions in NYC) and then later as an independent data base / software consultant. Although it was a bit late in life, I had a mid-life crisis in my 50's and became a professional photographer.

It was my great privilege to serve as a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) for Children in the Dependency Court system. Two years in San Diego and then a year in El Paso. This is what molded me to become a lifelong advocate for children.

Have been involved in Rotary since 2013, first as a charter member of Chiang Mai International Rotary Club (CMIRC) and now as a charter member of The Rotary Club to End Human Trafficking (RCEHT). Currently, I have the honor of serving as the Thailand Co-Coordinator for Rotary Action Group Against Slavery (RAGAS) and on the RAGAS board of directors.
