His overseas leadership as DHS Attaché in Jerusalem included establishing the first regional DHS/HSI office, implementing counter-financial crime and customs training for foreign agencies, and expanding cooperative investigative capacity. Domestically, as Resident Agent in Charge in Amarillo, Texas, Lance founded and led the multi-agency BEST task force, directed high-priority cross-border and domestic investigations, and mentored officers across local, state, and federal levels—demonstrating his commitment to interagency collaboration and sustainable capacity building. Accredited by FLETC as a Federal Law Enforcement Educator, he has organized and led financial crime and anti-trafficking conferences, provided policy recommendations to strengthen investigative operations, and contributed actively to Rotary International and NGOs focused on combating trafficking and child exploitation.
